## <u>Xello</u>

If you haven't already done so this year, go to <u>https://xello.world/wp-login.php</u> and log in to your Xello account. If you were using Career Cruising in the past, you will notice that Xello has a much different look and feel to it! Follow the steps below to research a health care career:

- 1. If you haven't already, take the Matchmaker quiz to see how your interests align with available careers in health care. Click the "Getting Started" button and Launch Matchmaker.
- 2. Once you are done with the Matchmaker questions, select the following:
  - a. Xello (upper left of screen)
  - b. Explore Options Careers
  - c. More filters scroll down to "Career Clusters" and select "Health Science"

d. Select the button on the bottom of the screen with the number of career ("93 Careers") You'll see immediately which health care careers are a good career match for you or not, and you can click on any career and "Find out Why" to see how your Matchmaker answers aligned with the skills for that particular career.
